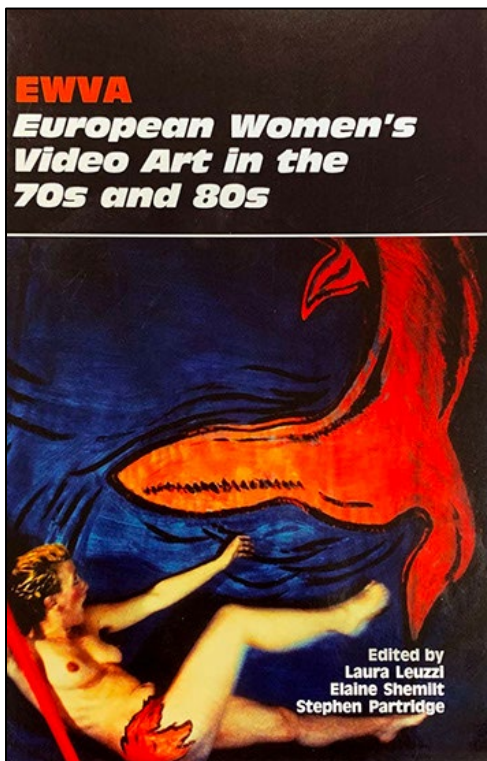


Figure 1. Front cover of "EWVA: European Women's Video Art in the 70s and 80s", a book published from the project

Project Summary

EWVA ("European Women's Video Art in the 70s and 80s") was an AHRC funded research project, based at DJCAD, University of Dundee. The project aimed to recover and reassess the seminal contribution of women artists to early video art in Europe, and more generally to the development and evolution of video as a then relatively new medium. Despite the fact that several women artists had been experimenting with the medium since the Seventies and Eighties, women artists' contribution to video art is still marginalised and has partially fallen into oblivion. Several women artists' video works are today lost or have not yet been migrated to digital archival formats, meaning that this topic remains under-researched and under-published. As such, this project filled a fundamental gap in the history of video art and aimed to provide a useful tool for individuals and organisations with an interest in this area. The project also contributed to the future recovery and digitisation of videotapes created by women artists, which are at risk of loss due to the obsolescence of the original physical formats. The project was launched in February 2015 at the Media Art Festival in Rome.
