Smart Glasses

SAVE AS FAVOURITE



A growing trend in consumer electronics is wearable technology. One of the latest iterations of this technology are smart glasses and the recently released Ray-Ban Stories, built by EssilorLuxottica and Facebook. These glasses are created with built-in cameras, microphones and speakers. Recording can be started with the wake phrase 'Hey Facebook, take a video' or by the tap of a button on the glasses,

When the glasses record, they have a small white LED to the side of one of the cameras to indicate that the camera is working; however, early usage has indicated this LED is dim enough that a passerby can miss when this LED is illuminated.

Pressure from privacy advocates has mounted towards Facebook over the years, with scrutiny over WhatsApp privacy policies to the massive Cambridge Analytica scandal. Has Facebook eroded trust enough with consumers to cause alarm that they are involved in these kinds of wearable pieces of technology with minimal alerts to bystanders about what data they are capturing?

As a note, filming or photography in a public place is not illegal in the UK.

It is proposed that regulation stipulates that wearable cameras must display when they are recording and that the indicator is visible in many different conditions from a minimum distance adjusted for lighting



What Is The Main Duty In This Case?




