WHAT IS FREEBIRTH


A birth that happens intentionally without the attendance of a qualified health care professional, even when free, universal access to midwifery care is provided by public health care services.

Anecdotal data seems to suggest freebirth is increasing in UK and other developed countries

RESEARCH QUESTION

What are the attitudes, opinions, and experiences on freebirth of UK registered midwives?

WHY WOMEN FREEBIRTH? A SYSTEMATIC LITERATURE REVIEW



There is a paucity of research exploring the views and experiences of midwives caring for women who freebirth
