This is a good, novel way of testing evolutionary psychology predictions relating to mate competition. The authors have managed to find a means of doing this as field work, looking at a large amount of data produced outside the confines of a lab. They interpret it well and add substantially to the literature on intrasexual competition. And while I would have liked to see more discussion about how culture potentially exacerbates the likelihood of men and women being shamed as they are here, or indeed the value of a man being influenced by his ability to provide, they tie it to the mate selection framework excellently.
