Adult virginity

Virginity loss

- Milestone to adulthood? (Lucas et al., 2024)
- Inexperience: negative, e.g., sadness, shame, insecurity, arrested state (Leroux & Boislard, 2023)
 - > Stigma as partners (Gesselman et al., 2017)
- Virgin shaming: young men (Fleming & Davis, 2018)
- Manosphere taxonomies: sexual conquest as a meritocratic measure of manhood (Smith, 2023)

Incels

- Outsource developmental maturity (Sharkey, 2022)
- Inadequacy, alienation, less value (Maryn et al., 2024) Chad = totem of failure (Fowler, 2022)
- Forums: safe spaces sexual inexperience, mental health (Smith et al., 2024)
 - Increasingly hostile: explanatory value of red pill?
 - "I didn't leave inceldom inceldom left me"





Incels

Who are the incels? (Blake & Brooks, 2023; Costello et al., 2022)

- 60-100k members
 - > Ages 18-30
 - Diverse: 55% white
 - Economically underprivileged, 50% at home, link to regional inequality (Brooks et al., 2022)
 - Mental health: 70% depression, 40% anxiety, 40% consider committing suicide every day Linked to feelings of failing as men (Daly & Laskovtsov, 2021) Subordinated?

Hegemonic masculinity

- Culturally dominant masculinity (Connell, 2020)
 - Authority, toughness, sexual prowess, heterosexuality
 - Subjugates/subordinates other masculinities and femininities
 - Hybrid masculinity: blend masculinity typologies (Brides & Pascoe, 2014)
- Incel weaponised subordination (Halpin et al., 2024)
 - Demean own feminine traits: victim/resistors of hegemonic masculinity
 - Legitimise misogyny/gender-based violence reclaim lost masculinity within norms



Adams & Smith (in revision)

- Many studies of radicalisation: distanced analysis
 - Cannot ask follow-ups/clarify meaning/develop inquiry into perspectives, sense-making and meaning
- Interviews with ex-incels
 - How did masculinity identification influence membership?
 - How was their masculine subordination reinforced?
 - How are masculinities reconstructed after exiting?



Method

- 11 members of ex-incel forums (50-150 mins)
- Life before, what they got from membership, changes since
- Deductive analysis via hegemonic masculinity framework (Braun & Clarke, 2021)
 - > Transcription, reading/familiarization, coding, searching for themes, reviewing themes, defining/naming themes, finalising analysis

Ethical concerns with interviewing? (Carian et al., 2023)

From shyness to radicalisation

Resistance to "masculine" autonomy

Comparative masculinity

Reinforces helplessness

Pessimism vs striving: lower expectations

Upwards social comparison

Incels were being unashamedly themselves, even if it was pathetic, there was rebellion in it that (P1)

Inverted hierarchy: humiliation + pride

The ugliest guy, who spent the most years without dating, the oldest virgin is the Alpha male (P8)

Savior of the damned

Fantasies of empowerment fantasies of striking back against all society that condemned me (P10) Insurmountable barriers, e.g., blaming social engineering

It showed how genetics play a role in everything.
[...] It felt like there was this conspiracy against me. Women would give affection to top men, and the rest of us would develop ourselves for years (P5)

Consolidation of futility e.g., sharing papers, cutting members

[ev psych] gave a rational foundation.
Before I could have been swayed by experiences like a guy saying 'I had success with women you can too.' American sites gave a justification for my ideas (P8)

Reject pursuit of hegemonic: all aspects unobtainable



Juxtaposed masculinities

Support for Hegemonic masculinity after inceldom

Changed mindset: gaining autonomy

I got introduced to the red pill and became serious about working out, improving my financial net worth, being more social, putting myself out there and making connections (P5) Complicit HM support: integrating with it

I still believe that discussing emotional matters or showing too much weakness as a man can be detrimental. It is what it is, and it's useless trying to change it. (P9)

Juxtaposing HM with incel identity


Subordinating remaining incels

Recognition of own positioning

The most visible ones are living with their mom when they're 32, playing video games 18 hours a day, have anime body pillows are overweight and have body odour (P3)

They're right in a lot of ways - it's not just about being yourself and being a cool guy and being nice person: you need to exhibit proper status demonstrators (P10)





Concluding remarks

Incels hybrid identities: subordinate/delegitimise non-HM identities (Halpin et al., 2022) Ex-incels: renewed focus on societal integration/competition: entrepreneurial (Smith., 2024) Leaving: strict adherence to incel ideologies/resistance towards HM via masculine praxis
