#### introduction

The intention of the policy is to provide regulators, and developers, with an efficient risk-hased approach for taking forward wave and titiel energy proposals. It distinguishes between those proposed developments for which there are sufficient growings to seek determination on a constraint application based on a minimum of 1 year of widelite survey effort and analysis to develop also characterisation in required. This would provide an dissuance that those developments that are larger in scale or in more amisternmentally sensitive areas are based upon an evidence based underestimating of the impacts of the devices, and allow Scentising and statistics of the time any licensing decisions on greater avarences and knowledge.

This policy will only be applied following discussion with Marine Scotland: Developers will still be required to undertake assessments required as part of the statutory licensing and consenting process, such as the provision of Environmental impact Assessments, and other, procedures necessary for complance with national and European conservation legislation.

#### The policy is based upon 3 main factors.

- Environmental Sensitivity (of the proposed development location)
- Scale of Development, and
- Device (or Technology) Classification

#### Environmental Sensitivity

Environmental sensitivity for the purposes of this policy, relates to designated areas, protected species, and protected habitats and other relevant environmental factors. It acceptant will undertake an assessment of the relative environmental sensitivity of the proposed location of a relevantal energy project, based on the environmental sensitivity maps effacthed at Annex 1. These maps combine data from 19 different environmental datasets, enabling onces of relatively higher and lower sensitivity to be distinguished.

The maps should be considered to be indicative only (ie. it is possible that at a local scale specific also may have a relatively greate or lower sensitivity than is shown). They are relevant only to marine renewables (wave and disal

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
